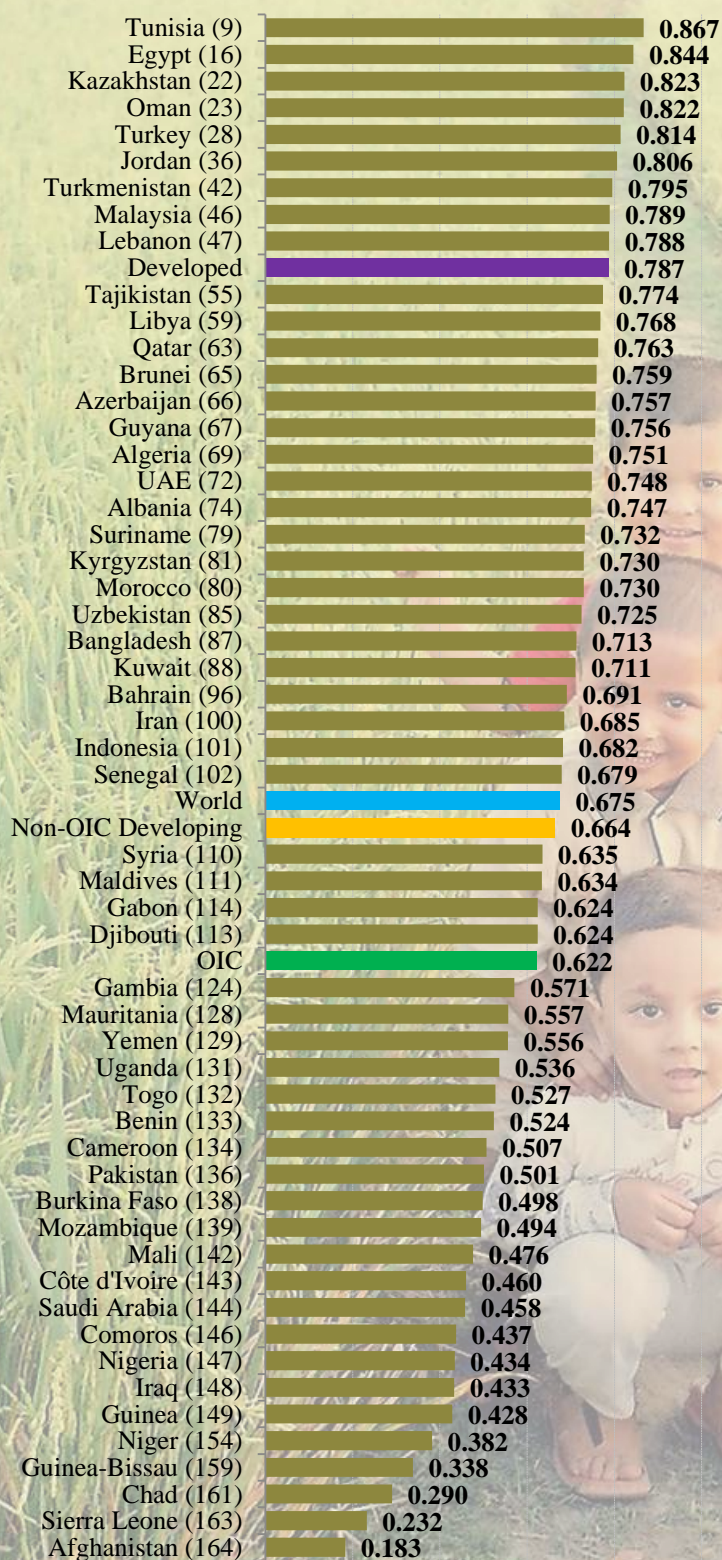


Did You Know?

KidsRights Index Score (2017)



✓ The **KidsRights Index** is an annual global index which ranks how countries adhere to and are equipped to improve children's rights. It is a composite index consisting from five domains, namely; Right to Life, Right to Health, Right to Education, Right to Protection, and Enabling Environment for Child Rights with a total of 23 indicators. It comprises a ranking for all UN member states that have ratified the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child and for which sufficient data is available, a total of 165 countries.

✓ The **OIC average score of 0.622** (calculated from the scores of 54 member countries) was poorer than that of the **World (0.675)**, **Non-OIC Developing (0.664)** and **Developed countries (0.787)**.

✓ At the individual country level, **9 OIC countries**; namely, **Tunisia, Egypt, Kazakhstan, Oman, Turkey, Jordan, Turkmenistan, Malaysia and Lebanon** scored above the average of the **Developed countries** group. In particular, **Tunisia** with its overall score of **0.867**, ranked **9th** in the **World**.

✓ The following member countries took the lead among the OIC countries in the domains of KidsRights Index:

- ✓ Right to life: **Lebanon** (ranked 32 in the World)
- ✓ Right to health: **UAE** (ranked 24 in the World)
- ✓ Right to education: **Egypt** (ranked 7 in the World)
- ✓ Right to protection: **Tunisia** (ranked 22 in the World)
- ✓ Enabling Environment for Child Rights: **Mauritania and Tunisia** (ranked 5-7 in the World)
