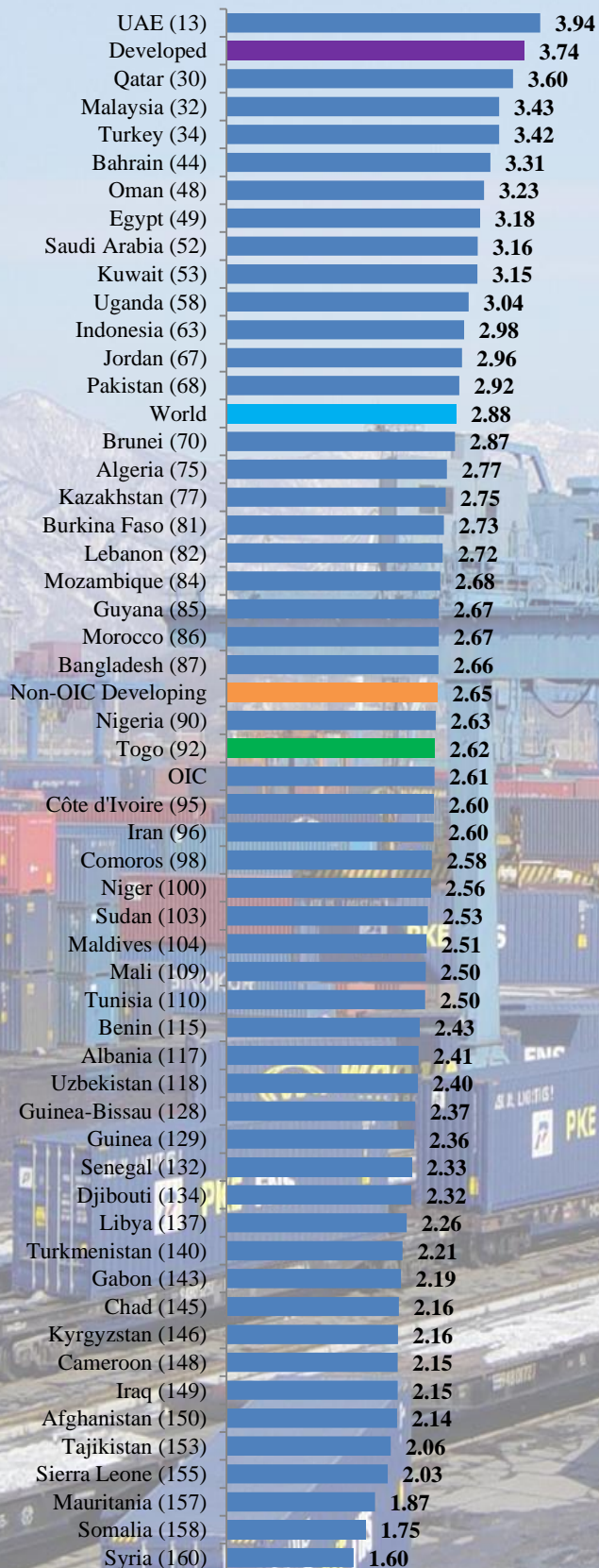


DID YOU KNOW?

- ✓ The overall score of the **Logistics Performance Index (LPI)** reflects perceptions about a country's logistics based on six core dimensions:
 - *efficiency of customs clearance process,*
 - *quality of trade-and transport-related infrastructure,*
 - *ease of arranging competitively priced shipments,*
 - *quality of logistics services,*
 - *ability to track and trace consignments*
 - *frequency with which shipments reach the consignee within the scheduled time.*
- ✓ The overall LPI score ranges from 1 to 5 where 1 is lowest and 5 is highest score. Higher LPI scores represent better performance.
- ✓ Data obtained from the Logistics Performance Index surveys in the 2016 round covered more than 7,000 country assessments across 160 countries.
- ✓ Of the **52 OIC member countries** with available data in year 2016, **13 countries**, namely **UAE, Qatar, Malaysia, Turkey, Bahrain, Oman, Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Uganda, Indonesia, Jordan and Pakistan**, achieved higher LPI overall scores than the **World** average of 2.88.
- ✓ With a score of 3.94, the performance of **UAE** was even better than the average of **Developed countries**, 3.74.
- ✓ Though being below the **World** average, the overall LPI scores of **9 OIC countries** including **Brunei, Algeria, Kazakhstan, Burkina Faso, Lebanon, Mozambique, Guyana, Morocco and Bangladesh** were above the average of **Non-OIC Developing countries**, 2.65, as well.
