Progress Report on "OIC Statistical Capacity Building (STATCAB) Programme"

1 Completed Activities

The OIC-StatCom Secretariat gives special attention to facilitate the flow of statistical and professional know-how among the National Statistical Systems (NSSs) of the OIC Member Countries. The OIC Statistical Capacity Building Programme (StatCaB) aims to identify and implement statistical skills improvement activities by matching the capacities and needs of the National Statistical Offices (NSOs) of the OIC Member Countries based on the responses provided to the biannual survey. The last survey titled "OIC Statistical Capacity Building Programme (StatCaB) Questionnaire for the Biennium 2016-2017" was circulated in summer 2015 after the Fifth Session of the OIC-StatCom. The Survey has received a record number of responses from 46 NSOs of the OIC Member Countries¹. Different from the previous biannual surveys, the last survey also included questions on the type of activities sought and provided by the OIC Member Countries.

Since 2007, the Centre has organized 190 statistical capacity building programmes including 152 short-term capacity building courses courses, 22 international workshops, 8 study visits, and 8 technical missions with the participation of approximately 3,870 experts from the NSOs of OIC member countries.

During the period between mid-May 2015 (after the Fifth Session of OIC-StatCom) and first week of November 2016, a total of 70 statistical capacity building activities with were conducted by SESRIC. Of those, 52 of them were short-term capacity building courses, 7 of them were study visits, 6 of them were technical missions, and 5 of them were workshops. In total, around 1,000 participants from 38 OIC Member Countries benefited from these

activities which were provided by 17 OIC Member Countries and 10 international organizations.

2 Way Forward

The OIC-StatCom Secretariat will be circulating the "OIC Statistical Capacity Building Programme (StatCaB) Questionnaire for the Biennium 2018-2019" by the end of the first half of 2017. Based on the interactions with the NSOs of the OIC Member Countries during the current period, the following changes / amendments are planned for the upcoming period:

- Collection of the biannual survey through an online form instead of Excel files;
- More statistical sub-activities to be asked in the biannual survey as broader items of the Classification of Statistical Activities (CSA – Revision 1, Oct. 2009) taxonomy sometimes oversee the activities sought and/or to be provided;





- Organisational processes will start with the Terms of Reference to be provided by the beneficiary countries after the matching of the countries with needs and capacities for the related statistical;
- Increase the number of OIC Member Countries to provide activities under the StatCaB Programme;
- Bring about more synergies in statistical capacity development with the regional agencies; such as, GCCStat, UNESCWA, for the benefit of the OIC Member Countries; and
- Responding more to the on-demand requests of the NSOs of the OIC Member Countries.
