Introduction

The eight "Millennium Development Goals" (MDGs) represents the mainstay for "Post-2015 Development Agenda " (SDGs). After the United Nations Millennium Declaration signed by 189 nations, a group of goals and objectives had been defined with timeframe to help tracking progress achieved towards the fulfillment of such commitments, at the forefront of those was "End poverty in all its forms everywhere".

Sustainable Development Goals (Post-2015 Action Agenda)

- ❑ **The 65th Annual UN DPI/NGO Conference titled '2015 and Beyond: Our Action Agenda, organized by the UN Department of Public Information and the NGO/DPI Executive Committee, started on August 27, 2011, to develop an action plan to mobilize and support partnerships before starting intergovernmental negotiations in the 69th session of UN General Assembly to adopt the post - 2015 development agenda.**

Sustainable Development Goals (Post-2015 Action Agenda)

- ❑ In June 2012, Heads of State and Government and high-level representatives, having met at Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, with the full participation of civil society, NGOs , private sector and other groups had met in United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development, Rio+20

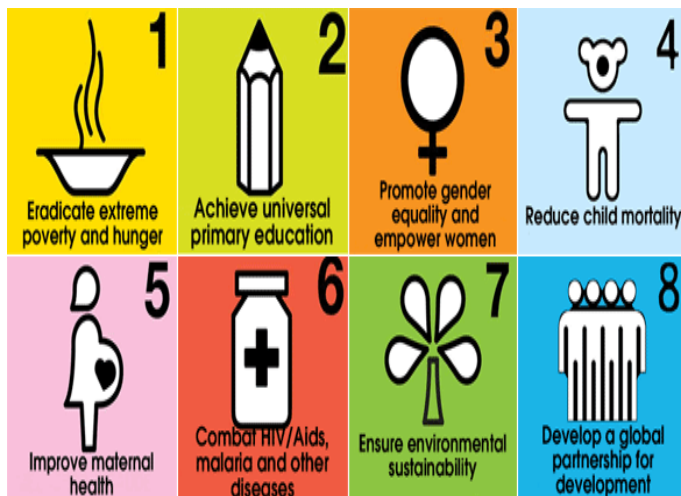

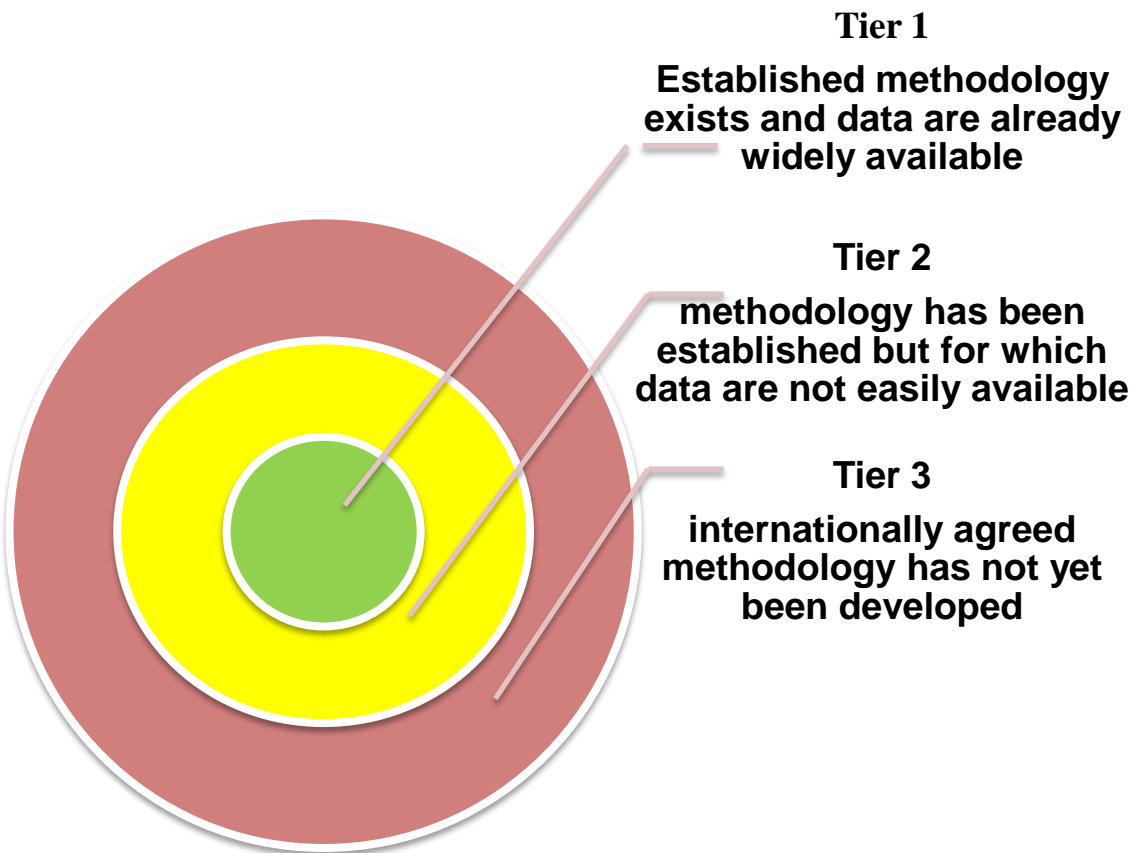

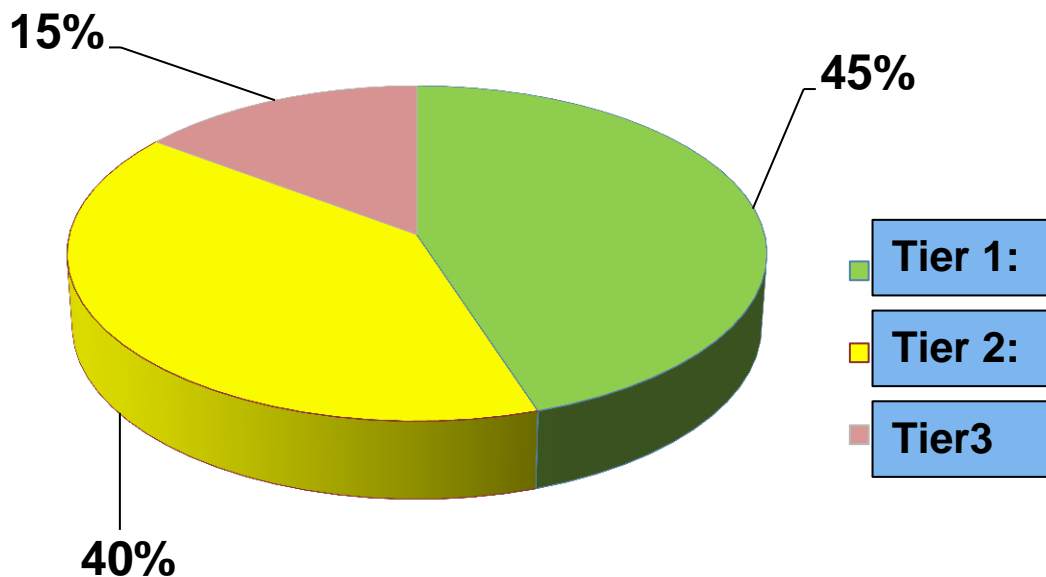

The Member States conducted an initial assessment of the proposed goals and targets to define the (feasibility, suitability and relevance) according to three-Tier evaluation system .

Initial assessment results according to Tier system



Assessment	Number of targets
Tier 1 Established Methodology Exists and Data are already widely available	76
Tier 2 Methodology has been Established but for which Data are not easily available	68
Tier 3 Internationally agreed methodology has not yet been developed	25
Total	169

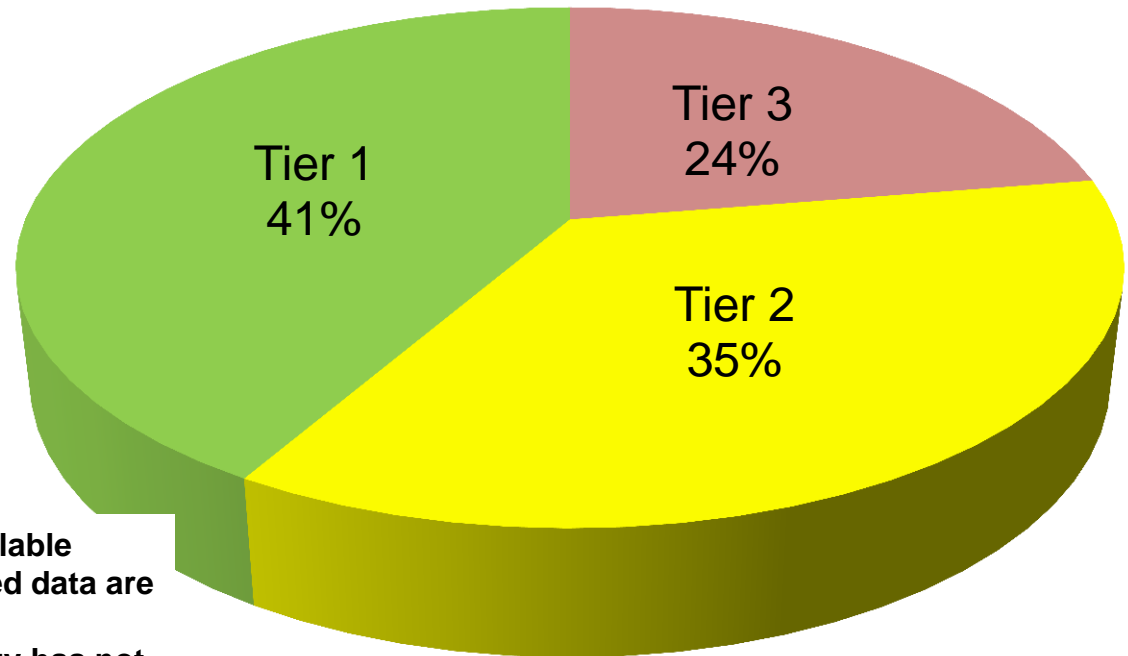
Efforts exerted by the CAPMAS

- Studying SDGs for example (identifying the agency responsible for the data – determine data source – knowing the institutional arrangements, if any, identifying metadata;.....etc.)
- Determine classifications required (by sex, age, place of residence, ...) and its availability.
- Identifying the needs from additional resources and external aid in the form of support capacity building for employees and conducting Multiple Indicator Cluster Surveys

CAPMAS assessment of SDGs according to Tier evaluation

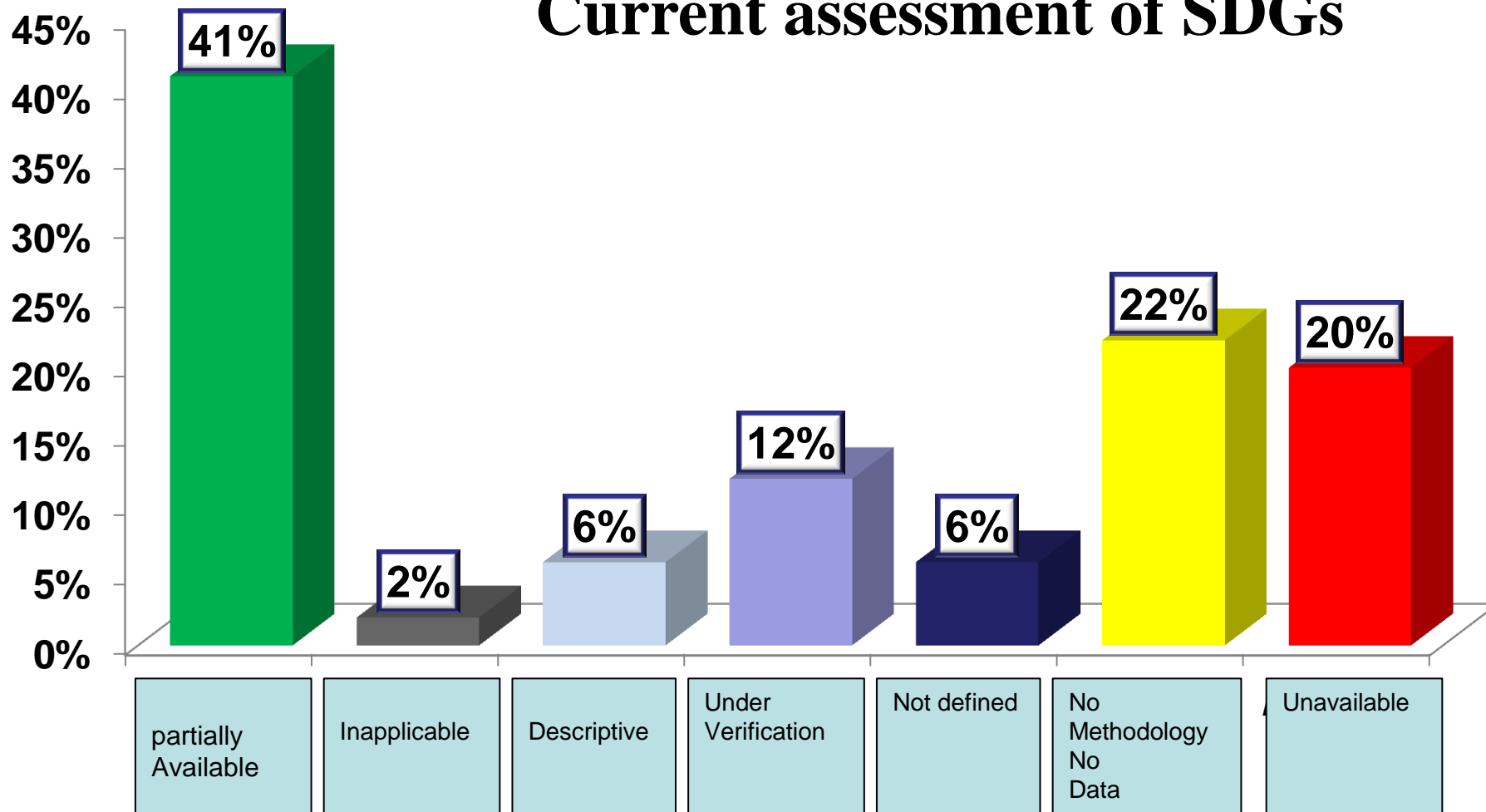


- Tier1** : methodology exists and data available
