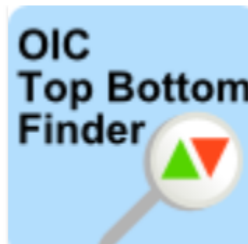

The OIC Statistics (OICStat) Database is the first and only international official statistics repository on the Member Countries of the [Organisation of Islamic Cooperation \(OIC\)](#). Enriched with the experience drawn from its predecessor Basic Social and Economic Indicators (BASEIND) Database, OICStat is periodically maintained to ensure the dissemination of most up-to-date through the inclusion of categories and indicators on the OIC Member Countries.

Equipped with more "user-friendly" features, OICStat currently hosts 379 indicators under 22 categories dating back to 1985.

To ensure data completeness and methodological comparability among the OIC Member Countries and the to-be-introduced aggregate groups, OIC-Stat currently presents data on OIC Member Countries extracted from databases of officially recognized international organisations including [Food and Agriculture Organization \(FAO\)](#), [International Labour Organization \(ILO\)](#), [International Monetary Fund \(IMF\)](#), [International Telecommunication Union \(ITU\)](#), [Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries \(OPEC\)](#), [Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development \(OECD\)](#), [United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization Institute for Statistics \(UNESCO, UIS\)](#), [United Nations Population Division \(UNPD\)](#), [United Nations Statistical Division \(UNSD\)](#), [World Bank](#), [World Health Organization \(WHO\)](#) and [World Tourism Organization \(UNWTO\)](#).

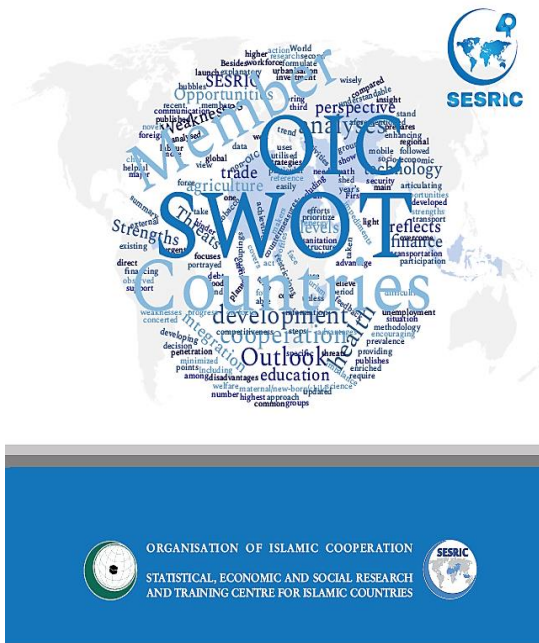

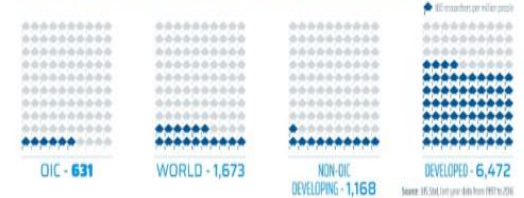

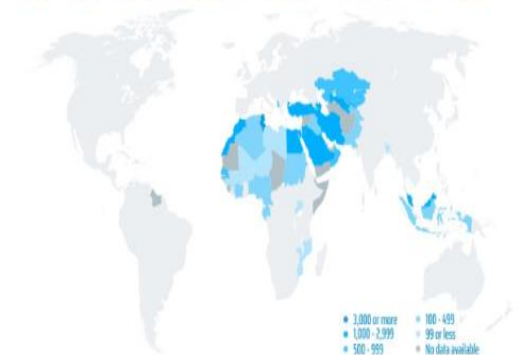

RESEARCHERS PER MILLION PEOPLE

OIC member countries, on average, employed 631 researchers per million people, which were equal to approximately one-tenth of Developed countries' average (6,472) and almost one-third of World average (1,673).



Tunisia (3,074), Malaysia (2,909), Turkey (2,342), Azerbaijan (1,654), Egypt (1,396), Morocco (1,386), Iran (1,250), Jordan (1,197), Saudi Arabia (1,170), Bahrain (1,145), Kuwait (1,120), Uzbekistan (1,060), and Palestine (1,026) have more than 1,000 researchers per million people.

SURVEY on IBFSTAT



- ❖ A **Stakeholders Meeting** was organized at World Bank – IMF Meetings in October 2016
- ❖ The Centre has developed and circulated a **survey on ‘Islamic Finance Industry Database for OIC Member Countries’** to gather a preliminary insight about existing data collection, compilation and dissemination concerning Islamic finance practices in OIC member countries first in January 2017.
- ❖ As of May 2018, **42 Institutions from 29 Countries** have submitted the survey responses:

To brief the Central Banks and Monetary Authorities, NSOs and other Financial Regulatory and Supervisory Authorities of OIC countries about the **SESRIC Project on Developing Islamic Finance Industry Database** and ultimately gather feedback from the representatives of the stakeholders.



1. *Increasing the availability of more indicators which are related to Islamic banking and finance industry by **determination of sectoral priorities** based on the level of accessibility of data (Islamic Banking, Islamic Capital Markets, Takaful, etc.)*
2. *Comprehensive analysis of the survey results after taking responses from more countries and institutions for planning and conducting statistical capacity building programs for countries where there is a need for collecting, compiling and dissemination Islamic finance data.*
3. *Collaboration with various stakeholders at national and international levels to improve the Islamic finance data quality and sound infrastructure for better data production and dissemination.*



- ❖ 13th Islamic Summit Conference Resolution OIC/SUM-13/2016/PAL-RES (Istanbul, 2016): Support and expand the Program for the economic empowerment of the Palestinian people and mobilize additional resources for the Program through voluntary contributions
- ❖ A 6-stage-business model with capacity development, social safety/protection, and finance/investment
- ❖ From statistical perspective, SESRIC directly contributes to the identification of the capacities and needs of Palestinian refugees in Turkey through questionnaire design and orienting the pollsters for data collection

STATCAB SURVEY FOR BIENNIUM 2018-2019

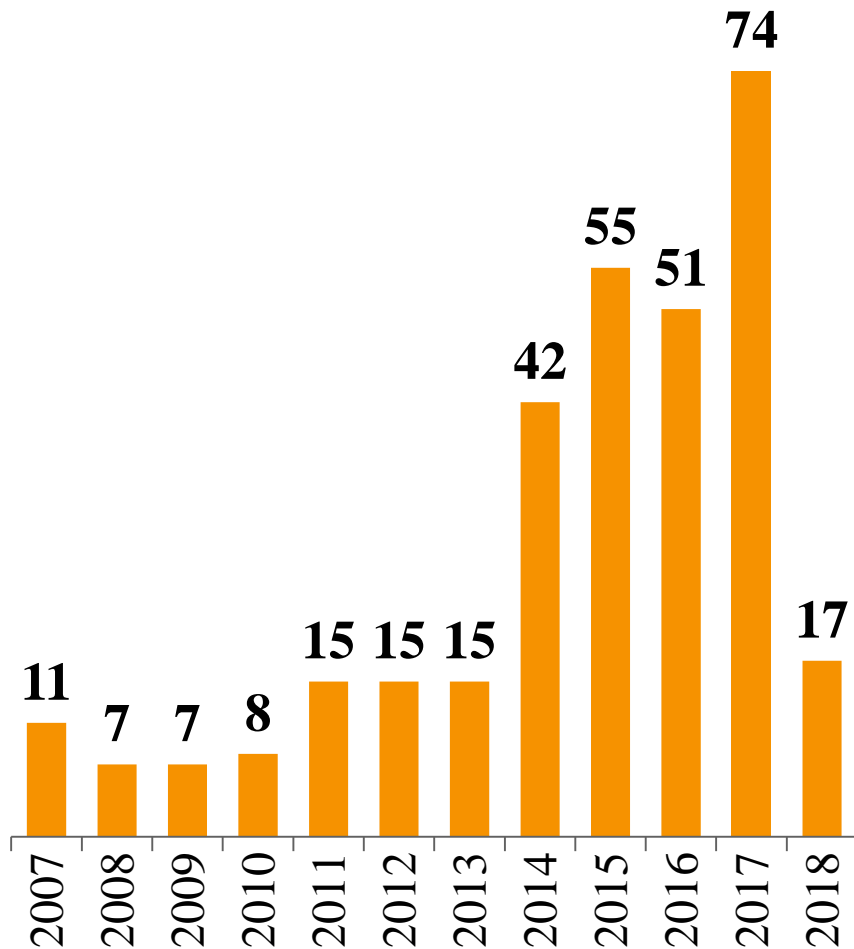

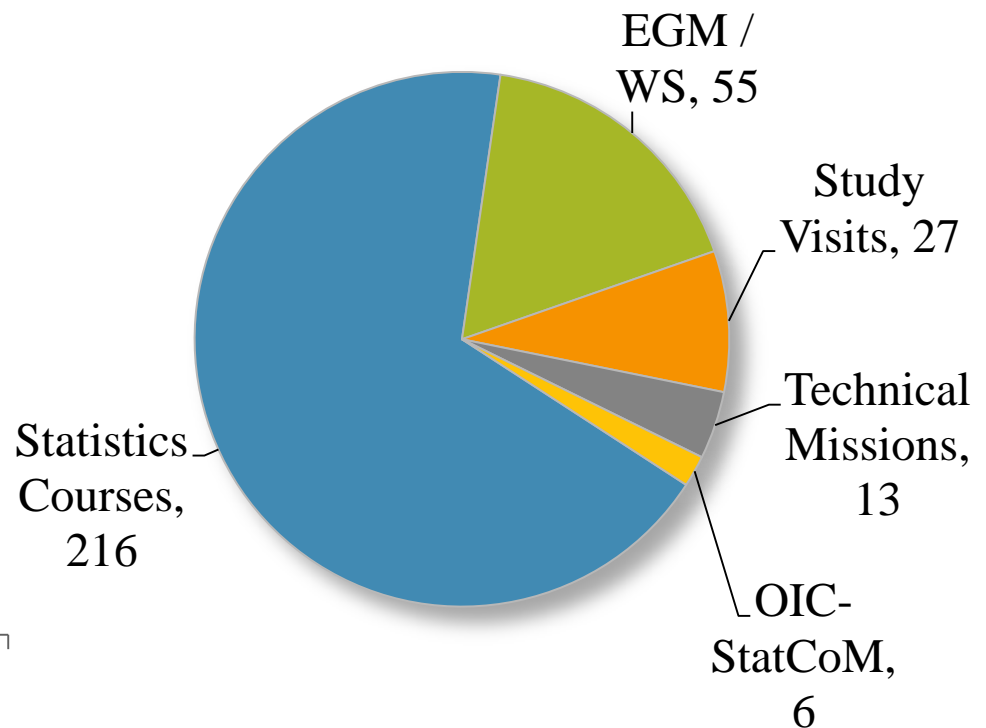

by Year, 2007 – April 2018**

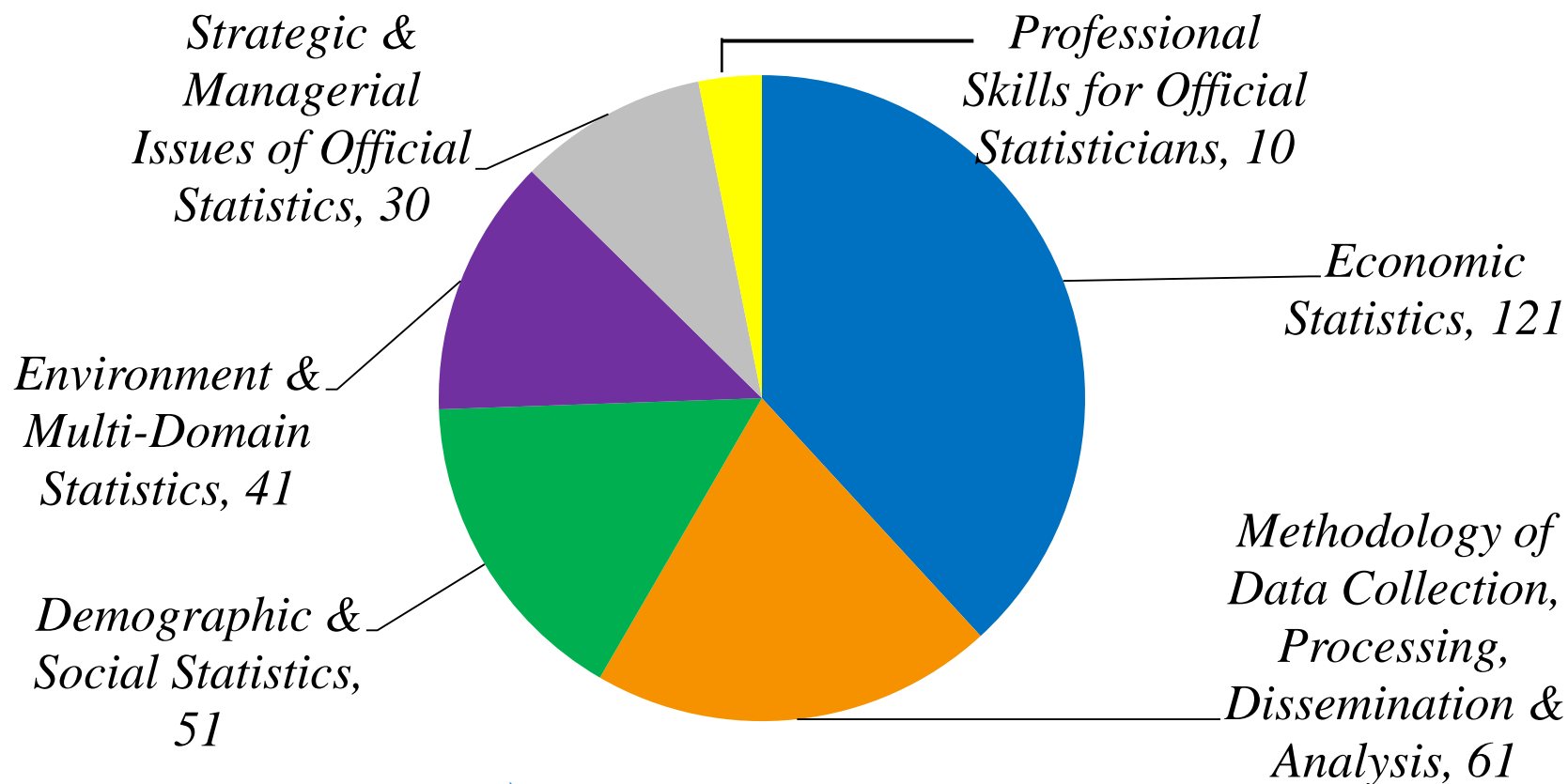


**Distribution of Statistical Activities,

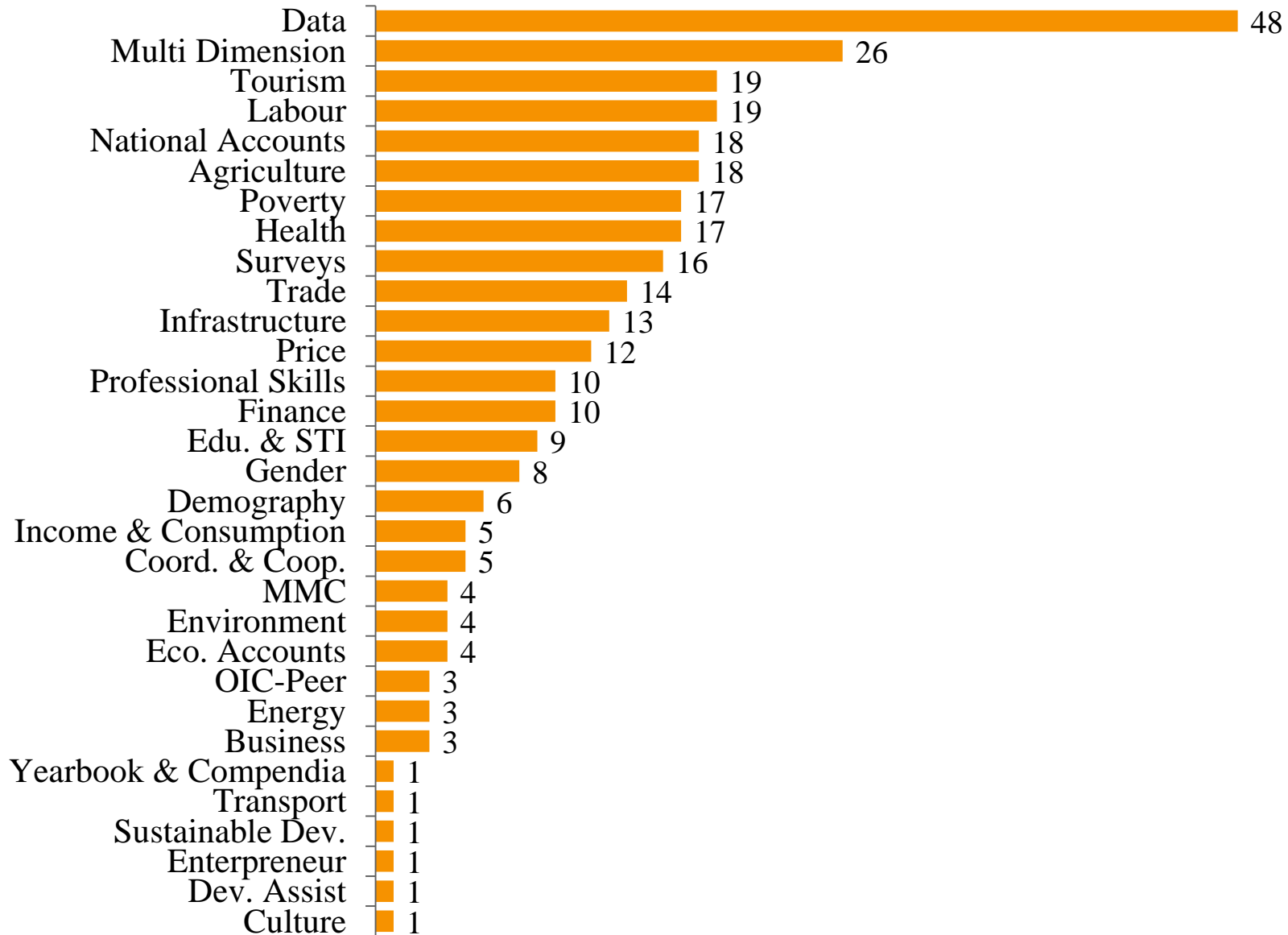

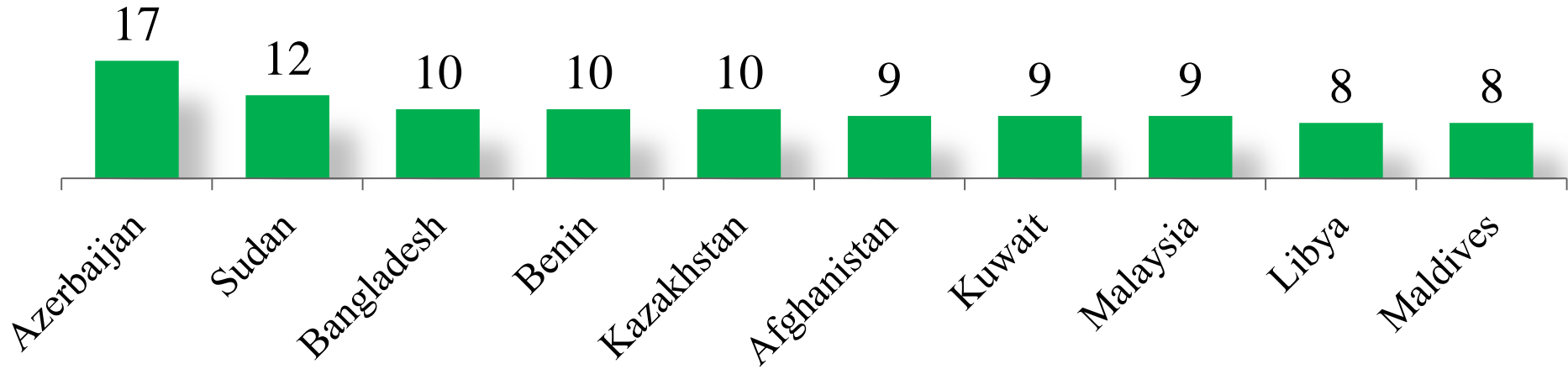


Number of Statistical Activities Conducted, by Theme, 2007 - April 2018

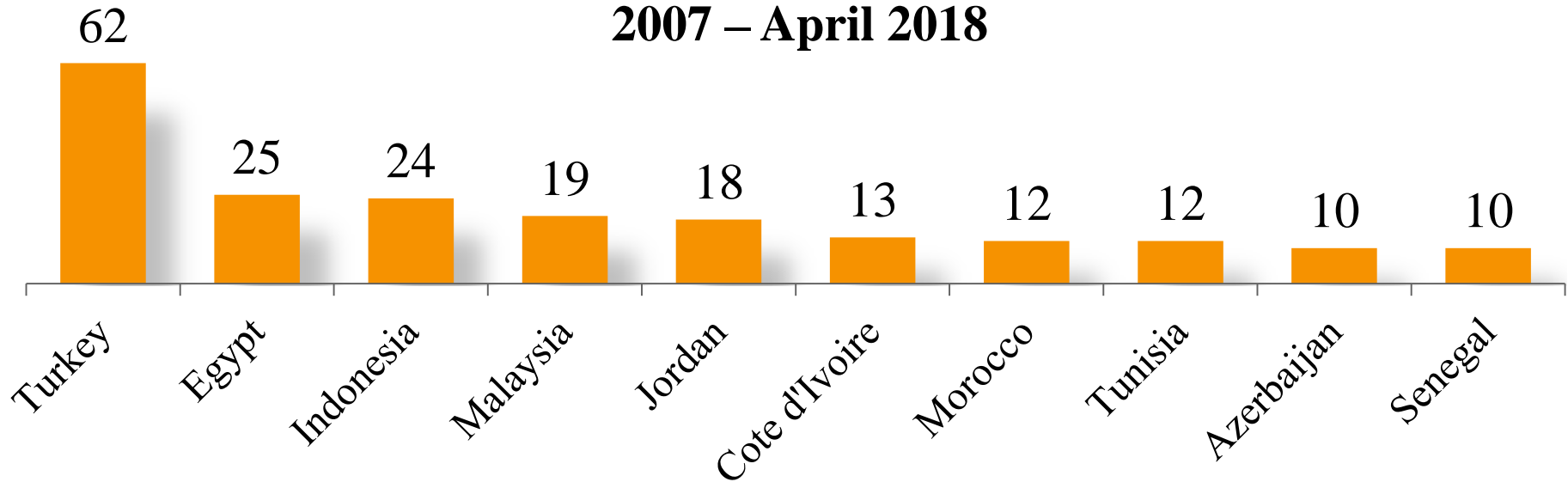




TOP 10 COUNTRIES BENEFITED FROM STATCAB, 2007 – April 2018

- **Study Visits and Technical Missions:** Consultation through short term technical visits on survey design, methodology, sampling, etc.

- **Study Design:** Consultation on sample design, and data collection and management procedures.
- **Analysis and Reporting:** Consultation on analyzing and reporting data obtained from TQS questions, including the construction of indicators, tables, and graphs.
- **Training materials and consultation for multi-country TQS and tobacco control trainings.** **Next Workshop on TQS planned to be held in August 2018.**

- Enhancing the **credibility** of the NSOs of OIC countries
