- The situation of Muslim communities in the diaspora countries – profiles (religious, cultural, professional, educational) difficulties/challenges, opportunities, discrimination
- Host countries' perceptions and attitudes social relations, negative attitudes, effectiveness of integration and migration attitudes
- Muslim diaspora's relations with home country visits, cultural differentiation, feeling of exclusion, level of interest issues at home

Primaries

- The size, both absolute and relative to the host country population, of the Muslim community in the country;
- Diversity of the Muslim community reflecting a plurality of ethnic, cultural, religious backgrounds
- Significant differences in the migration histories of the selected countries, particularly in relation to the migration of Muslim communities (e.g. colonial migration, labour migration, asylum-seeking, etc.)

- Demographic features -population, age-gender, marriage, ethnic-national demography
- ➤ Education profile -educational conditions, educational rights, access to education
- Socio-economic structure and mobility -professional positions, level of revenues, business sectors, employability
- Political participation -voting patterns, association membership, citizenship, civil society

- Legal procedures -means of education, marriage procedures
- Religious organizations and associations -religion-oriented structures, centers, courses, organizations
- ➤ National and cross-national relations -with host society and other minorities, politico-cultural and economic relations with the country of origin
- Visibility in the Media and public opinion discussions -media reports/news/projects on the Muslim community



GMD'S INTERACTIVE PLATFORM


- An interactive platform has been built to provide a summarized information of the main findings of the Global Muslim Diaspora (GMD) project.














