Towards realizing this noble goal, SESRIC has initiated the idea of bringing the DCIs together.

Considering the importance of sharing our development experiences and knowledge with the aim of enhancing our efforts to achieve our national development goals, including the Millennium Development Goals, we believe that the outcome of this meeting will significantly contribute to the efforts of our Member Countries towards alleviating poverty and raising the standards of living of their population.

In fact, given the high level of capacity of the relevant institutions of OIC Member States, we have many evidences to believe that our initiative would improve the life conditions of our people and improve the overall well-being and prosperity. By sharing our knowledge and experience in the area of socio-economic development, and cohering our policies and practises across in areas like agriculture, trade, investment, migration and others the possible impact of individual efforts of the DCIs would significantly increase.

I am also very pleased to inform you about a very important initiative of SESRIC which I believe to be strongly associated with the work of development and cooperation institutions of the OIC Member States. The OIC Vocational Education and Training Programme (OIC-VET) developed by our Centre and approved by the 24th session of COMCEC targets the development of vocational/professional skills in the Member States through the transfer of accumulated expertise and experience of the Member States. The first meeting of Monitoring and Advisory Committee is being held today in Izmir during the 25th session of the Follow-Up Committee of the COMCEC and we will certainly share the outcomes with you.

I wish this meeting to be the starting point of efficient collaboration of the development and cooperation institutions of the OIC Member States, and thank you all for your participation in this very important meeting.
