

- Turkey is situated in one of the most seismically active regions in the world.
- Active fault zones are found in two thirds of the country where 70% of the population live.





- There was no mobile hospital




Seismic risk in Van Province

- 23 October 2011
- M 7.2
- Erciş and Van Cities
- 40 seconds
- 9 November 2011, an earthquake of M5.7 hit again

- 28 532 damaged buildings
- 650 000 people affected
- 644 deaths
- > 4000 injuries
- 222 rescued alive

Van Province health facilities affected by earthquakes of 23 October and 9 November 2011




