14:00 - 15:45	 SDG Target 2.1 Indicators During the session, an overview of food security measurement and introduction to the SDG target 2.1 indicators will be presented; particularly, the indicators of the prevalence of undernourishment (PoU) and the prevalence of moderate or severe food insecurity based on the Food Insecurity Experience Scale (FIES). 16:15 - 18:00	Focus on the PoU and FIES This session informs the participants about the PoU methodology by considering what it measures, underlying model, and the data needed to calculate it. The session goes on with the FIES methodology by focusing on what it measures, its brief history, theoretical basis, survey modules and reference periods. The session also considers what the FIES adds to the toolkit of food security measures by concentrating on the FIES-based indicators to guide policy and programmes. The session is to be concluded with how information resulting from the use of FIES can be analysed together with other relevant information to understand causes and consequences of constrained food access. Preparing to Produce SDG Target 2.1 Indicators at the Country Level			
09:00 - 11:00	:	FIES and PoU This session covers in detail the identification of appropriate survey vehicles for administering the FIES survey module, guidelines and challenges in collecting food consumption data to produce the PoU, steps to be taken to include the FIES in a survey and collect data, adaptation of FIES survey module and insertion in survey questionnaire, interviewer training, and how to accurately and effectively communicate the PoU by focusing on the relationship between the PoU and the Prevalence of Food Insecurity based on the FIES.
