11:00 - 13:00 <u>Session I:</u> Better Statistics for Better Policy Response During and Post-Crisis World

In late 2008, the world was engulfed in financial crisis which morphed into global downturn. Data became a major issue as policymakers and researchers across the world

were deeply interested in understanding the extent to which the crisis affects poverty and other associated sectors of the economy. Could availability of data allow us to pre-empt and predict the onset and the impact of crisis? Were national statistical offices as well as regional and international statistical data users and providers prepared to respond adequately to demand for data during and after the crisis? What are the issues of data collection and disseminations that should be addressed and lessons learnt from the recent crisis and what should be done to remedy the shortfall in post-crisis era? It is universally agreed that better statistics lead to better policy formulation. Can access to data help member countries' economies prepare well for any future crisis? The session will also consider the issues on the collection and dissemination of specific indicators, such as Islamic finance, awqaf and zekat, that are particularly important for the OIC Member Countries.

09:00 – 10:30 <u>Session III</u>: Capacity Building Initiatives at the OIC Level

The increasing role of statistical capacity building in support of NSOs activities is crucial for strengthening national statistical systems, which in turn will lead to improved data for both national development plan and monitoring of international initiatives including MDGs and OIC Ten Year Action Plan. Thus, there is a need for coordinated use of scarce financial and technical resources available at the OIC and other international institutions for the NSOs. In this session, international institutions providing technical and financial support for the NSOs will make presentations on the progress of their activities as well as their future plans and programmes. The views and comments of the NSOs regarding the capacity building activities by international organizations will be instrumental in enhancing the design and expected outcomes of these activities.

Data providers are primarily the NSOs while data users vary widely including OIC institutions and researchers worldwide. In recent years, there has been sustained efforts to develop database (e.g. SESRIC's BASEIND and IDB's COSDAT etc.) all require constant data from NSOs. Unfortunately, there is a considerable communication gap between the NSOs and international data users, and in many cases this leads to missing or incomplete data on some indicators for some years. In this regard, there is urgent need to discuss the root causes of data communication gap at the level of NSOs with the view to find everlasting solutions to bridge the communication gap.
